I disagree with this idea. First, there is a strong possibility that women will quit their jobs when they get married or have a baby. People who might leave suddenly should not hold high positions in the government and major corporations. Second, setting a minimum percentage means that even when it may

be necessary to put women in key positions even when they are not qualified for them, cutting off men who could do the work better. This is unfair, and won't be of any help in reducing the promotion gap between men and women. (95 words)

Most politicians and company directors are men and unsympathetic to women's needs, so few daycare centers are built, little maternity leave is given, and companies that mistreat female employees go unpunished. Educated and talented women give up promising careers to become housewives. Their skills, experience and knowledge, which could help Japanese companies to develop new products, are wasted. The only way to change this situation is to put more women in powerful positions in companies and government departments. (124 words)

I disagree with this idea. It is true that we need more female business leaders and politicians. Japanese companies are falling behind their rivals in other countries due to a lack of new ideas. With their fresh perspective, women can help firms to create new products and services that will be popular all over the world. To be effective, leaders must earn their position by showing superior ability. Otherwise, they will not be respected by their subordinates. I disagree with the statement. I have three reasons for this. First, "every university student" includes those who already studied abroad for a whole year when in high school. It also applies to those who have some reason that makes it hard to leave Japan, such as physical handicaps. That is not only nonsense but, in the latter case, can violate human rights. Second, the cost of studying overseas is too high for many or most college students to cover themselves. Third, to be sure, to stay in another country when young is a beneficial experience. However, it is just a waste of time for those who want to do in Japan what they think is more meaningful. (118 words)

【A予備校・解答例 1 】

I agree with this opinion. It is reported that an increasing number of Japanese students want to stay in Japan for their entire university education. I think that's because studying abroad isn't compulsory: they can graduate without taking the trouble to do that. However, studying abroad for at least one semester (even though it seems to be rather a short period) will surely bring about good changes in them, as well as improving their ability to understand another language. They will learn a lot by interacting with people from different cultural backgrounds. (92 words)

【A予備校・解答例 2】

I don't think so. For students who want to get a job abroad or one in which they have to communicate with people from other countries, such a requirement might be okay, but if someone intends to live in Japan for the rest of their lives, they have no reason to study abroad. Moreover, it is expensive: it is often said that it costs about two million yen to study abroad for one year, which means that even staying for one semester would cost from six hundred thousand to one million. Of course there are many students who couldn't afford that. (101 words)

I disagree with this idea. It is true that a few university students can benefit from studying abroad, provided they do so for at least a year. They can master a foreign language and gain access to research facilities that are not available in Japan, for example. However, most students will do non-academic work for domestic companies after they graduate. They will use Japanese when dealing with their colleagues and customers, not English or other languages. I agree. Look at teenagers on the train. They are all busy using their smartphones. Some of them are using Twitter or Line, some reading manga, and some are playing games. They are getting more stupid than ever before. They even risk losing their lives: they might fall off platforms or down stairs because they often stop to check their smartphones and someone from behind may bump into them. Moreover, they are becoming poorer at using their imaginations. They are used to seeing images on the screen and don't know how to imagine things that are in print. (98 words)

【A予備校・解答例 2】

I agree. First, smartphones discourage teenagers from thinking for themselves. Certainly, with smartphones, we can easily search the Internet for things we want to know wherever we are, which may be helpful. But if teenagers depend on them too much, and don't learn anything by themselves, they soon will not be able to do anything without a smartphone. Second, friendships have become less close. Many teenagers boast of the number of friends they have on SNSs like Facebook, but that doesn't mean they have 'real' friends. There is no point having someone as a friend when we haven't even met them. (101 words)

I disagree. One good thing about smartphones is that they let us get information quite easily. They are very useful and effective for learning. Older people may insist that reading paper books is the one and only way to accumulate knowledge, and complain that teenagers these days, who don't like reading, are becoming more and more ignorant, but I don't think they are right. Moreover, in case of emergency, nothing can help us more than a smartphone. Suppose a serious accident or a natural disaster happens. We can immediately ask our family or the police for help or tell them whether we are all right or not. (107 words)

I disagree. First, smartphones make it possible to have a lot more free time. In the past, people had to go to the library and spend hours finding information they needed, but teenagers today don't have to do that because with smartphones they can find what they need on the spot. We can use the time doing something more productive such as working part time, instead. Second, smartphones lighten our load. Teenagers once had to carry a lot of books or dictionaries, which sometimes caused back injuries. Now, we don't have to carry that much, since we can carry dozens of books and dictionaries in one smartphone. (107 words)

I agree with this statement. It is true that smartphones have many good points. Teenagers can use them to communicate with their friends and families quickly and cheaply using text messages, for example. This improves their social lives and prevents their parents from worrying about their safety. In my opinion, however, the disadvantages of the phones outweigh these benefits. The socialmedia notifications that appear on their screens every few minutes prevent students from concentrating on their studies. Young people feel obliged to respond quickly to new messages, so they text when they should be writing their essays or listening to what their teachers are saying. What is worse, the phones can be used to play games and videos. These are very addictive, especially when the user is wearing headphones, and discourage young people from going out doors and exercising. (139words)

I agree with the statement that for teenagers, smartphones do more harm than good. It has been a great-discussed topic recently how young people in general spend less and less time holding face-to-face conversations with family and friends. And this is largely because they are so distracted by their smartphones and the 'virtual' relationships they seem to find so important on the Internet. I believe that teenagers especially need to develop and polish their social skills by interacting with real people. They do not need smartphones for that. (88 words)

"Peaceful protests should not turn violent even if protesters feel that their voices are being ignored."

I agree with this statement. The first reason is that violent protests inevitably produce violent reactions of authority. The actual source of political power is, even in democratic countries, not public opinion but police and military forces. Therefore, protesters' unprepared, spontaneous physical conduct almost always ends up being suppressed. The second is that violence also arouses the same wild behavior of the opposite-side people. Therefore, many of the supporters of peaceful protests may well keep a distance from the radical movement. In short, violent actions are not an effective way of resisting the government. (94 words)

【A予備校・解答例1】

I agree with this opinion. Saying "Peaceful protests should not turn violent" is a contradiction. The word "peaceful" means not resorting to violence, so if protests turn violent, they can no longer be called "peaceful"; they are now "violent" protests. Moreover, if protests turn into violent riots, the protesters' voices will be ignored even more, contrary to their expectations. Who would be willing to listen to people who reject the possibility of discussion? Their demonstrations will no doubt end up being suppressed. In order to get the authorities to accept their demands, they must be ready to negotiate peacefully. (99 words)

【A予備校・解答例 2 】

I disagree with this statement. If people just keep trying to make their complaints in moderate ways, that is, through discussion or negotiation, but find to their disappointment that their voices remain unheard, they will have no choice but to resort to violence. Moreover, I believe that violent ways of protesting are sometimes inevitable. For example, when faced with something that threatens our existence, such as dictatorship or the suppression of human rights, all of us should be prepared to stand up and confront them with violence. Protesting in peaceful ways will get us nowhere; nothing will ever change. (99 words)

【B予備校・解答例1】

I agree that protests should never turn violent for two reasons. First, violence scares away potential supporters. Any effective protest movement must appeal to a wider audience to achieve its main goals, but violence does not attract the kinds of support needed to enact change. Recently at Black Lives Matter rallies in America, a small minority began rioting and needlessly damaged the image of the whole movement. Such violence turned many against the movement even though most Americans want African-Americans to be protected. Second, people do not respect those who use violence. Protest movements need admirable and charismatic leaders who can inspire people through peaceful means. Martin Luther King Junior's use of non-violent protests was particularly successful in gaining the admiration of white Americans and they became increasingly sympathetic to the suffering of African-Americans. I believe that violence should always be a last resort. Certainly, it should be avoided if possible, but in some countries where people are not allowed to protest freely, those who are oppressed have no choice but to become violent. It may be the only way for such people to get their message out to the outside world. If these supporters can gain the support of foreign governments, these governments may in turn help to put pressure on the government in that country. Also, it is often only violence that threatens dictators' hold on power, so such dictators may be willing to give into protestors' demands if it prevents further violence. (111 words)

I agree with the statement for the following two reasons. First, a "peaceful" protest means that — that it is peaceful. If a "peaceful" protest turns violent, then people who may have considered supporting the protesters, might be turned off and give up any idea of lending them support. In other words, trust would be lost. Second, although we have seen both violent and non-violent protests throughout history, it is the non-violent protest movements that have had the most lasting impacts. Good examples are Mahatma Gandhi's and Martin Luther King's respective non-violent movements to free India from British colonial rule and to gain more equality for black people in the USA. (110 words)

Also, in countries led by dictators, only those with hidden identities feel safe enough to report the truth and criticize the government. Indeed, if they used their real names, they would run the risk of being arrested or even executed. Clearly, anonymity is essential for free speech. (103words)

I disagree with the statement. I believe that anonymity should be protected in online interactions. I have two reasons for this. First, the opportunity to speak freely without concern for social standing is a strength of being online. Second, being anonymous makes it easier to speak your mind without feeling the pressure of other people's eyes on you. For example, it would be easier to accuse people of doing bad things in an organization, which can make society more transparent. While it is understandable that the use of real names has a deterrent effect on crime, the benefits of anonymity are greater than those of using real names on the internet.
